THE IDEALS OF MEMBERSHIP:

The enjoyment of golf depends a great deal on the co-operation, consideration and courtesy extended by fellow competitors.

What is true of the game also applies to Club Membership.

The spirit and image of a Golf Club is projected by the way fellow members show respect, courtesy and consideration to one another.

This courtesy and consideration should extend to the choice of dress generally, in the standard of conduct on the course and in the Clubhouse.

The standards of a Golf Club may be judged by the etiquette of its members.

Members are asked to give close attention to the following thereby avoiding penalties, promoting harmony and making the game pleasant for all:

1. The Rules of Golf
2. The Etiquette of the game
3. Your speed of play i.e. your position in the field relative to the group you are following
4. The Local Rules
5. The Regulations governing conditions of play/competition.

DRESS STANDARDS:

Green Acres Dress Code has been designed to reflect the standard of the Club yet be practical for all Club members.

The Club's Management, Director of Golf and Golf Staff are authorised by the Board to ensure that members, visitors and spectators comply with the dress code. Persons not complying with the dress code may be required to leave the Clubhouse or the course.

THE COURSE AND PRACTICE FACILITIES

Golfing attire, both on the course and in the Clubhouse, is to be clean, tidy and appropriate to the game.

In order to assist members and visitors to interpret this expectation, the following standards will be applied when considering the suitability of dress.

Unless otherwise stated these guidelines apply to both men and women.

CLOTHING

- Men's trousers and shorts may not be of the style with a drawstring or elasticised waist.
- Denim jeans or shorts are not acceptable.
- Track, leisure or lycra fabric pants are not acceptable.
- Trousers and shorts designed to be worn with a belt must be worn with a belt.
- Trousers must not be tucked into socks.
- Ladies shorts and skirts must be appropriate golf attire.
- Ladies 3/4 pants must be tailored and styled for golf.
- Golf turtle neck style shirts are acceptable.
- Men's shirts must have a collar and be tucked in to trousers/shorts.
- Ladies shirts preferably to be collared. Any top worn without a collar must have sleeves. Tops worn outside slacks/shorts must be tailored.
- Tee shirts or denim shirts are not acceptable.
- All clothing, including hats, caps and visors, must be free from excessive advertising, other than designer or golf related subjects.

SOCKS

- Socks of any length may be worn with shorts.
- Men's short socks must be predominantly white in colour.
- Socks may have small logos.
- Socks must be worn with footwear.

SHOES

- For players or caddies only "golf shoes" are permitted.
- Only soft golf spikes are permitted.
- Thongs and boots of any kind are not acceptable.

IN THE CLUBHOUSE AND SURROUNDS

Neat casual dress is the minimum standard acceptable within the confines of the Clubhouse.

In general terms, attire which is acceptable on the course will be acceptable in the Clubhouse, the exception being denim jeans. Denim jeans may be worn in the Clubhouse but they must be clean and tidy and not of the frayed or torn variety. As with the course standard, track pants, 'casual' shorts and tee shirts are not acceptable.

Men must wear shoes. Thongs and sandals are not acceptable.

Golf shoes with soft spikes may be worn in the Clubhouse.

Caps, visors or hats must be removed inside the Clubhouse.

THIS DRESS CODE APPLIES TO MEMBERS, MEMBERS' GUESTS, SPECTATORS AND 'CORPORATE DAY' PLAYERS.

It does not apply to children 12 years or under.

Please Note: Members are responsible to inform their guests in advance of our requirements to avoid any embarrassment on the day.

ETIQUETTE:

The low handicap player of a group is responsible to ensure that players observe the etiquette of golf which implies thoughtfulness for others.

Players are reminded of their responsibility to others on the course and that a two stroke penalty or disqualification can be applied in competitions for slow play.

In the interests of all players you are requested to:

1. Check the Local Rules and any Temporary Local Rules before you hit off;
2. Keep up with the group in front. If you fall one hole behind you must call the following players through without request. Should players in the front fail to call you through in these circumstances, you should request to play through in the traditional way, by calling 'Fore', and await acknowledgement of the signal;
3. Do not walk ahead of someone still to play but aim to position yourself and select your club before it is your turn to play. Ready Golf is permitted and encouraged to ensure pace of play is maintained. On the putting green repair your plug mark and study the line of your putt before it is your turn to play;
4. Consider pulling the bag of the last player on the tee forward immediately after the player has played his shot. This can help save time;
5. Watch other players' shots and if there appears to be a possibility of a ball being hard to find, mark its position carefully and discuss your view of the probable position as you walk forward with the player;
6. Move briskly between shots and stay aware of your responsibilities to other players in the field;
7. Play a provisional ball when your ball may be hard to find in long rough or trees;
8. Call following players through if they are waiting and your ball is not immediately found. Every player may search for their ball for 5 minutes, but waiting players must be called on to play through if it is your turn to play and your ball has not been found.

Players who call through another match should, if convenient, play their next shot and walk forward with the group called through. They should then not resume play until the players called through are out of range;

9. It is recommended that, where practical, those players whose ball is not involved in a search play their next shot prior to assisting in the search.
10. All golf buggies must remain outside the blue line at the front of greens and wheeled or driven to the rear or side of the green nearest to the next tee. It is also helpful if another member of the group pulls the buggy through to the exit of the green if you are playing.

Players must not commence a round from tees other than the 1st or 10th without the approval of the Director of Golf, Golf Staff or General Manager.

Players engaged in official Club Competitions, as listed in the syllabus, or specifically approved by the Golf Operations Sub-Committee, shall have precedence over other players.

In competitions, unless the conditions of the event demand otherwise, formations of four shall have precedence over other formations; otherwise all players playing in formations of two, three or four have equal rights on the course.

A single player or formation of more than four has no rights and must give way to other formations. In competition rounds, on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays during the hitting off times from 7.00 a.m. to 9.00 a.m. and from 11.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m., or as may be listed on the booking sheet, groups commencing on the 1st and 10th tees have precedence.

At all other times, groups proceeding from the 9th or 18th greens must alternate with groups waiting to commence their rounds on the 10th and 1st tees as the case may be.

Players engaged in social rounds are requested to make up formations of four to even the flow of play.

PLAYING RIGHTS:

Subject to the special rights and precedence of competitors in official competitions, the following playing rights apply:

7 DAY CATEGORIES

May play every day.

6 DAY CATEGORIES

May play every day except Saturday.

WEEKDAY CATEGORIES

May play every weekday.

Lady Weekday Members may play on Tuesday in the Ladies Running Ball Comp after 12.00 noon.

Men Weekday Members may play on Tuesday after 12.00 noon.

May play on Sunday afternoons up to 12 times during a Club year by introducing themselves with their self introductory card or by being introduced by a member with rights on these days and upon payment of the relevant green fees. Weekday Members may not introduce guests on Sundays.

RESTRICTED

May play 12 times during a club year on any Sunday to Friday by introducing themselves with their self-introductory card and another 12 times by being introduced by a member with playing rights on the specific day and paying the relevant green fees. Restricted Members may play in Mixed Events and twilight competitions, subject to the conditions of the competition on payment of the relevant fee. Restricted Members cannot play in the Ladies Tuesday Competition. Restricted Members cannot introduce playing guests.

RESTRICTED - Limited Veteran

If the Restricted Member is aged 70 and over and with at least 25 years of membership, such member may play non competition golf on any Monday, Tuesday and Thursday after 3 pm and may play in the Friday 9 hole competition.

TEMPORARY AND CORPORATE NOMINEE

May play every day but not in Honour Board events.

MEMBERSHIP DISC OR GREEN FEE RECEIPT:

All members with playing rights must have a current membership disc attached and visible on their golf bag. Visitors and Restricted Members must attach and exhibit their Green Fee receipt on their golf bag.

PLAYING TIMES:

ALL PLAYERS MUST REPORT TO THE GOLF SHOP PRIOR TO HITTING OFF

Restrictions as to members' hit off times on certain days are imposed, not for their own sake, but in an effort to optimise the enjoyment of the large number of members and their guests who use our course.

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE PLAYING TIMES GENERALLY HAVE BEEN STANDARDISED TO ENSURE COMMON STARTING TIMES.

NO SOCIAL ROUND MAY START UNTIL THE COMPETITION FIELD IS THROUGH THE CROSSOVER OR WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE DIRECTOR OF GOLF OR GOLF STAFF.

MONDAY

18 hole round

1st tee and 10th tee: 7.00am – 9.00am

Men's Stableford competition commencing at:

1st tee and 10th tee: 11.30am - 1.30pm

AM or PM – Possible Corporate Day – Check the Running Sheet on notice board in the sign on area or the website What's On section.

TUESDAY

Booking Sheet for one and a half tees, open eight days prior at 2.00pm

Ladies' Competition for 7 and 6 Day Ladies 1st Tee and 10th Tee: 7.00am - 9.00am

1st Tee: 11.30am - 1.00pm

Social Play 10th tee only: 12.00 noon - 1.30pm

WEDNESDAY

Social Play (Men may play in Competition) 1st tee and 10th tee: 7.00am – 9.00am

Men's Competition Booking Sheet for one tee only, open eight days prior at 2.00pm

1st tee and 10th tee: 11.30am – 1.30pm

Twilight Dine and Nine – During Daylight Saving
Booking Sheet for both tees, open eight days prior at 2.00pm

1st tee and 10th tee: 3.30pm – 6.00pm

SATURDAY

Booking Sheet for one tee only, open eight days prior at 2.00pm.

Men's Competition for 7 Day Members

1st tee and 10th tee: 7.00am-9.00am and 11.30am-1.30pm

SUNDAY

Medley Competition (Men and Women)

1st tee and 10th tee: 7am - 9am and 11.30am - 1.30pm

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

1st tee and 10th tee: 7am - 9am and 11.30am - 1.30pm

On Sundays and Public Holidays, players who elect to hit off either tee before 7am must give way to those hitting off between 7am and 9am before proceeding to their second nine holes. With Summer and the early morning light, a large number of members (and guests) use the course on Sunday morning with increasingly early starts. Consequently, members who hit off before 'official' tee times can, on occasions, disrupt the later field and this is unacceptable.

On dates when official Club events are being played, tee times may be varied. Players in Club events have precedence on the course.

MEMBERS ARE REQUIRED TO ALWAYS CHECK THEIR SYLLABUS, AND REFER TO THE NOTICEBOARD OR WEBSITE FOR ANY CHANGES TO THE SYLLABUS.

CROSSOVER

THE 1st AND 10th TEES ARE CLOSED BETWEEN THE LAST AM TEE OFF TIME AND FIRST PM TEE OFF TIME TO ALLOW FOR COMPETITION CROSSOVER.

THIS IS ALSO APPLICABLE FROM THE LAST PM TEE TIME UNTIL APPROXIMATELY 3.30PM.

DIRECTOR OF GOLF STARTING AND PLAY REQUIREMENTS

The Director of Golf and Golf Staff has the responsibility for the maintenance of the pace of play at Green Acres. Each group must keep up with the group ahead. The Committee considers that the average rounds should be completed in no more than the following times: -

- **Par/Stableford up to 4 hours 10 minutes or 13 minutes per hole**
- **Stroke up to 4 hours 20 minutes or 14 minutes per hole**
- **Match play up to 4 hours 20 minutes or 14 minutes per hole.**

The Director of Golf and Golf Staff have the authority to enforce the pace of play times and members must be alert to these times and when requested to move, do so as directed.

STARTING

The starting of the fields is the critical action in maintaining the Club's pace of play requirements. Delays in hit off times create a starting backlog and that will culminate in the extension of hit off slots past the allocated times. This 'bulge' extends into the field causing delay to play throughout the course.

TIME SLOTS

At Green Acres we use the combination of a booked timesheet and a walk-up time sheet. The walk-up tee can often get overloaded by late arrivals or large fields who expect to hit off and when they are allowed, they create the delay bulge.

The final hit off time will be strictly enforced with members turned away if the hit off time limit is exceeded.

The critical issue is the time that the final formation hit off (i.e. the last player has walked off the tee).

ARRIVAL TIMES AND BEING PREPARED TO PLAY

All members must be ready to play 10 minutes before the notified start time. If a member is not available at this time the Director of Golf and Golf Staff may utilise the slot (booked sheet).

STARTING POWER

The Director of Golf and Golf Staff has the authority to change players between tees and between slots to ensure that the pace of play targets are met.

Members who refuse to move will be relegated to the tail of the field on the walk-up tee and could miss a game.

The Director of Golf and Golf Staff will only use these powers to ensure playing speed is maintained. Regular playing groups will continue to enjoy the traditional formation selection arrangements but must understand that the comfort of the members on an overall basis is the predominant objective.

COURSE MARSHALLING

The Director of Golf and Golf Staff are responsible for maintaining the on course speed of play. All actual formation hit off times will be recorded and these times will be used to monitor and determine where formations should be in relation to the game being played and allotted pace per hole.

The Course Marshall has the Committees authorisation to:

1. Warn the group that they are behind schedule and have one hole to pick up the speed.
2. Ask the formation to call the following group through and supervise the call through process.
3. After being warned and failing to improve field position; the Course Marshall may request the group to pick up their balls and move quickly to the next tee. This will apply to Par/Stableford events and will result in the loss of that hole for each member in the formation.
4. Penalise the whole formation two strokes in a Stroke event (Rule 6).
5. The Course Marshall will report all warnings and penalties to the Board.

COMMITTEE ACTION

Failure to abide by the directions of the Director of Golf and Golf Staff in any of their functions (starting/marshalling) will result in the Committee taking disciplinary action against the offenders.

SUMMARY

The functions of the Director of Golf and Golf Staff are designed to produce the best golfing conditions for all members. The Committee expects support and co-operation as it takes action to ensure comfortable golfing conditions.

PRACTICE AREAS:

We have limited practice areas and for safety and practical reasons, certain restrictions are necessary.

PRACTICE TEE (RESTRICTED USE)

A practice tee area is available from which balls may be hit down the 10th fairway only. Balls may not be hit from the 10th fairway towards the tee.

This area can only be used on weekdays before 8am provided that no competition is being played at that time. The practice tee may also be used after 3.30pm when the competition field has completed the crossover except on Wednesdays during Nine and Dine and Thursdays during the Mens' Pennant season.

PRACTICE NETS

Open at all times. Members are reminded to be as quiet as possible in consideration of our neighbours.

DIRECTOR OF GOLF AREA

The area behind the practice nets is reserved for teaching by the Golf Staff Professionals and must not be used by members.

PRACTICE AREA - CHIPPING, PUTTING GREEN and BUNKER are open and available when the Golf Staff Professionals are not conducting golf lessons from the teaching tee. Members practicing must give way and not cause interruption to teaching being conducted by the Golf Staff Professionals. Members practice at their own risk and must be alert to players teeing off from the 10th tee and the practice tee.

PUTTING GREEN NEAR GOLF SHOP

Open at all times, but when a number of members are using the facility, it is requested that each person uses a maximum of two balls.

ON COURSE

A player is not permitted to play more than two balls during a practice round. Only tee markers of the day are to be used.

COURSE RADIO EMERGENCY SYSTEM

Location points of our Course Emergency System are the 7th, 13th and 16th tees.

The operating instructions are located on each site pole and must be followed to ensure all emergency details are recorded correctly.

NB: If in an emergency a member uses a mobile phone, it is essential to advise the office of your actions.

FIRST AID – First Aid kits are located in the Golf Shop, Clubhouse and the Ladies Committee Room.

COURSE WARNING SIGNS – Please observe and take notice of the warning signs near the practice chipping facility, between the 6th green and 7th tee, and the 12th green to 13th tee, when crossing the 18th fairway.

CLUB COMPETITIONS:

Members must be financial to play in Club competitions. To compete in Club competitions, a player must enter his/her name in the competition of the day at the Golf Shop and/or in the Special Events book, or on a sheet or list provided for this purpose in the sign-on area:

- (a) In weekly events, before starting play.
- (b) In "Special" events, by the closing date of entries.

The Golf Operations Sub-Committee may disqualify any competitor who does not satisfy these requirements.

For all competitions, the first countback is over holes 10 - 18, the second countback is over holes 13 - 18, the third countback is over holes 16 - 18, and the fourth countback is backwards from the 18th hole. The minimum number of players for a Club competition is 20 and six players for a ball competition.

Match Play events which end all square shall be continued hole by hole from where the match began until one side wins a hole, with strokes in handicap events being allowed as if the match had recommenced.

All Match Play events must be completed on the day set down in the syllabus, except those events for which deadline dates are specified.

NOTE: In Mixed Events, Ladies take strokes against Par where shown on the Score Card.

HANDICAPS – MEN:

The validity of the handicapping system and the rules of golf require the prompt return of all competition cards. Members are expected to return all completed cards properly signed by themselves and their marker. Players are responsible for playing on correct handicaps, which must appear on score cards before they are returned.

The maximum Golf Australia handicap is 36.

Maximum handicap permitted for use at Green Acres in Open events, Guests Days, Honour Board events and Monthly Medal Competitions is 27.

HANDICAP SYSTEM – MEN

A maximum handicap of 27 will be allocated to all new members.

MEN'S GUEST DAYS:

Invited Guests must have appropriate playing rights to participate on these days and have a current Australian handicap.

Members are reminded to refer to Eligibility of Visitors and Visitors in selected By Laws.

Saturday 6 March 2010 – 4BBB Stableford*

Wednesday 5 May 2010 – 4BBB Stableford
(Member/Guest Only) Visitors must have a minimum of weekday membership at their home club.
Green Acres members may play with another member eligible to play on the day, where a vacancy exists no sooner than three days prior to the guest day.

Saturday 24 July 2010 – 4BBB Stableford
(Father and Son Day) (Member/Guest Only)*

Saturday 25 September 2010 – 4BBB Stableford*

* Denotes:- Members and Guests must have 7 Day playing rights. Green Acres members may play with another member eligible to play on the day, where a vacancy exists no sooner than three days prior to the Guest Day.

MEN'S ANNUAL CLUB EVENTS:

MATCH PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP - Open to members with full playing rights. Restricted to 32 players, played over five rounds of scratch match play with the losing players in each round being eliminated.

31/1/10, 14/2/10 and 21/2/10.

PAIRS AGGREGATE - Open to members with full playing rights. A handicap stroke event played in pairs over 36 holes. Winners to be the pair with the lowest aggregate nett score. Played 30/1/10 and 6/2/10

GREEN ACRES CUP - Open to members with full playing rights. Decided by a four ball match play knockout. 1st Round. on 13/2/10, 2nd Round. on/by 20/2/10, 3rd Round. on/by 13/3/10. Quarter Finals on/by 24/4/10. Semi Finals on/by 15/5/10. Final on 29/5/10.

J.F. MULVANY TROPHY - Open to members with full playing rights, aged 50 and over on the day of the competition. Decided over 18 holes Stroke play in conjunction with the monthly medal, lowest nett score to win. To be played on Saturday 27/02/10.

FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP - Open to members with full playing rights. To be decided over 36 holes stroke play. Lowest gross score to win. Played 7/03/10.

CAPTAIN'S PUTTER - Open to members with full playing rights. Event decided by match play knockout. Event limited to 128 players. 1st Round on 17/4/10, 2nd Round on or by 8/5/10, 3rd Round on or by 22/5/10, 4th Round on or by 26/6/10, Quarter Finals on or by 10/7/10, Semi Finals on or by 28/8/10 and Final on 11/9/10.

FOURSOMES HANDICAP - Open to members with full playing rights. Qualifiers to be the eight pairs with the lowest nett stroke score over 18 holes. The winners decided by 18 holes handicap match play. Qualifying Round played on 19/06/2010. Match play 27/6/10, 4/7/10 and 18/7/10.

ANNUAL MEDALLIST'S PLAY-OFF - Open to members who have won a medal in the preceding 12 months. Played in conjunction with July Medal 3/7/10.

GRANDFATHER'S TROPHY - Open to members with full playing rights who are Grandfathers. Decided over 18 holes handicap stroke play, the winner being the best nett score. To be played on 3/7/10.

FATHER and SON TROPHY - Played in conjunction with the Member/Guest Day on Saturday 24/7/10. Open to all members with full playing rights and to all member's Guests who have SATURDAY PLAYING RIGHTS at their Club. Each pair must consist of a 'Father' and 'Son' combination. Winners to represent Club in VGA Father and Son competition.

FOUNDER'S CUP - Open to members with full playing rights. Qualifiers from 18 holes handicap stroke play on 31/7/10. Best 8 nett scores to qualify for handicap matchplay. Quarter Finals 7/8/10, Semi Finals 14/8/10, Final 21/8/10.

ETIQUETTE WHEN VISITING A RECIPROCAL CLUB:

Green Acres is fortunate to have reciprocal relationships with several Clubs which in common with us have various demands on their course and Clubhouse. It is therefore essential that when visiting a reciprocal Club all members observe the following procedures:

1. Make Prior Arrangements

All members should either write to or telephone the Secretary Manager of the reciprocal Club well in advance of the proposed date of visit and indicate preferred times when you wish to visit. Confirmation from the reciprocal Club should be obtained.

2. Have a Current Letter of Introduction

A letter of introduction is required by the reciprocal Club. This should not be more than one month old when presented. This card confirms your class of membership as well as your handicap. When visiting, members should understand that most reciprocal Clubs extend privileges which are comparable to those enjoyed by that member at Green Acres. Some reciprocal Clubs may not recognise members not resident in Victoria, i.e. Absentee Members. Likewise playing times may be restricted to various classes of member. This situation should be clarified with the host Club in advance to prevent embarrassment.

3. Number of Visits and Green Fees

Some of our reciprocal Clubs will limit the number of occasions that a Green Acres Member may use the course and Clubhouse. Generally, Green Acres Members will be welcome for short term visits. Some reciprocal Clubs do charge green fees.

4. Bringing Visitors with You

Members who are visiting reciprocal Clubs need to clarify whether or not they are allowed to introduce one or more visitors and what green fees are likely to be incurred. Most Clubs do have restrictions and again this should be clarified with the Club beforehand.

1. That visits to away clubs by any member be limited as per that particular Clubs requirement.
2. That no green fees be charged by the host club.

Members are encouraged to make full use of the Clubhouse facilities and utilise their prepaid Members Account. Our catering staff takes pride in providing for special functions, e.g. Birthday Parties, Weddings, etc. Please contact our Functions Co-ordinator with your enquiry for full details.

SELECTED BY LAWS:

Lowest Handicap Player Responsible

The lowest handicap player in a formation is responsible for the maintenance of the etiquette of golf by the formation.

Junior Formations

Junior Members, under 18, are required to play in formations where there is no more than one other Junior Member under 18 years and such Juniors shall not be permitted to mark each others card.

Precedence on the Course

The President, Captain and official guests of the Club shall be given precedence throughout the course at all times.

Ball Searchers

Ball searchers approved by the General Manager are the only persons permitted to search, at large, for golf balls on the course. All balls found by approved searchers on the course must be first offered for sale to the Director of Golf.

Discs on Bags

All players must display on their golf bag the Club identification disc or a current receipt for green fees.

Suspension of Play

(i) Suspension of Competition Play

In the event that the Golf/Competitions Sub-Committee deems the course to be unplayable during competition play, a siren will sound continuously for 15 seconds. Players must proceed in accordance with Rule 6-8b.

A siren will sound three short bursts to signify that play will resume.

Players are asked to assist those furthest from the Clubhouse alerting them to the fact that the siren has sounded.

(ii) Competition Play/Inclement Weather

If 50% of a starting field complete or can complete their round within four and a half hours of the last hit-off time or delay in play (suspension) has not exceeded half an hour, a competition shall not be abandoned or altered in any way.

(In defining 50%, should groups withdraw due to inclement weather, and other groups behind continue and complete the round, all players in front of them are deemed to have finished despite the fact that they left the course). Where less than 50% can complete their round as outlined above, the competition of the day shall be cancelled and a sweepstake (ball comp) conducted instead. Medals, Honour Board, Special and sponsored events shall be re-scheduled where possible.

(iii) In the event of the actual or forecast weather conditions on the day making the play of the teams competition impractical, the starter may exercise his discretion and alter the competition to a singles event.

Close of Competition

Unless it otherwise determines, the Golf/Competitions Sub-Committee shall disqualify any competitor who fails to return an 18 hole competition card by 6.00pm.

Eligibility of Visitors

Visitors may be entered in Club competitions subject to the payment of green fees and competition entry fees except on Saturdays (other than guest days) when they can play only with the prior approval of the Captain. On Guest Days, green fees are waived. For Ladies on Tuesday afternoon and for Men on Wednesdays, green fees are waived for visitors introduced under the Yarra Courses Reciprocal Agreement but the competition entry fee is to be paid.

Visitors

Visitors may be introduced by members on any day other than Saturdays and Tuesdays. (Guest Days excepted). On Saturdays, visitors may be introduced with the permission of the President, Captain or General Manager. On Tuesdays, visitors may be introduced with the permission of the Lady President, Lady Captain or General Manager. The visitor so introduced must play in the competition of the day. Visitors may be introduced on Wednesday afternoon, if field sizes permit. Members should contact the Golf Shop prior to bringing a visitor on Wednesday afternoon.

Visitors may be introduced under the terms of the Yarra Courses Reciprocal Agreement.

Visitors may play a maximum of 12 times a year. However, play in the Green Acres twilight event or Green Acres mixed events do not count in this 12 limit. Spouses of members may be introduced without limit provided the full members' guest fee is paid and all other visitor conditions are met.

Visitors must conform to the Club's dress and playing rules.

A member may bring three visitors except on Sunday prior to 11.30am where only one visitor may be introduced.

Visitors must have a current Golf Australia handicap.

Visitors to be entered in Visitors Book

The host member shall enter the visitor's name in the Visitor's Book in the Club foyer immediately on entering the Club unless the visitor has already been entered in the register maintained in the Club Golf Shop as a golfing visitor.

Staff Gratuities

Direct "tipping" of staff is contrary to Club policy, but a gratuity box shall be made available for this purpose. An appeal to members for donations is made annually and all gratuities are distributed in December.

Instructions to Staff

Only the General Manager is authorised to instruct or discipline an employee of the Club.

Complaints

Complaints by members concerning the management of the Club or its employees shall be made in writing to the General Manager who will take appropriate action. Complaints concerning the General Manager shall be addressed to the President.

Course Usage

Pursuant to Article 3 which states that the Club is established, particularly for the purpose of providing and maintaining a suitable golf course, it is declared that the major purpose of the golf course is playing of golf.

The conducting or playing of any other sports or sporting activity or recreational activity on the course (including but not limited to walking, jogging or running) other than in the course of playing, watching or administering golf, is not permitted. The Committee may, on application, permit any such activity from time to time and subject to any condition that the Committee deems appropriate.

Access to Course

Member, member guests and/or visitors entry or access to the course is only permitted via the Clubhouse or designated pathway between the Clubhouse and Golf Shop.

Protection of Property

No member shall remove from the Club or damage any article which is the property of the Club. In addition to any penalty imposed by the Committee, the members shall be liable to make good any loss or damage suffered by the Club to the satisfaction of the Committee.

Dogs

Except for guide dogs, members or visitors shall not take dogs into the Clubhouse or on to the course.

Mobile Phones

Mobile phones shall not be used within the area defined by the external walls of the Clubhouse nor on the course except in the case of a medical or mechanical emergency.

Children

Players under 16 years of age shall not play golf on the course unless they are members, or have the express permission of the Captain.

Persons under 10 years of age are not permitted on the course without prior approval of the General Manager or Captain and then only if they are accompanied by an adult member responsible for them.

Buggies

Buggies, bags and clubs must not be stored in locker rooms other than in a locker. Buggies must be folded before being brought into the locker room, and the equipment placed in a locker immediately. Bicycles are not to be stored in the locker rooms.

Smoking

Smoking is prohibited within the area defined by the external walls of the Clubhouse.
