Question: Ian's tee shot is struck towards an area of tall grass near a water hazard. He plays a provisional ball into the same area as his original ball. The balls have identical markings and Ian cannot distinguish between them. Both balls are found in the water hazard within a search of five minutes. How must Ian proceed?

Answer: As Ian's original ball is lost in the water hazard due to his inability to identify it (see Definition of "Lost Ball" and analogous Decision 27/10), he must proceed under Rule 26-1 with respect to the original ball; his next stroke would be his third. (see Decision 27/11)
