- Tomorrow is the 2nd Round of the 2009 Club Championship. A cut will be made to the top 16 + ties in each grade to progress to the 3rd Round.
 - Next weeks sheet has reserved times for Championship qualifiers. Once the sheet is full tonight, enter yourself on the waiting list at reception. When the qualifiers are determined, the vacancies will be filled from the waiting list.
 - Time is extremely important tomorrow so you MUST be ready to tee off early. You are expected to report to the Pro Shop well before your tee time to enable them to mark you off, collect your cards and get out to your tee.
 - Speed of Play is again, as always, very important. Respect the guys who want to qualify in the championships by always keeping up with the group in front. Call the group behind to come through when searching for balls. If your shot may be lost outside a hazard or out of bounds hit a provisional. Call up on the par threes. Let the shorter hitters tee off first. Most important of all, always go straight to your ball and be ready to play your shot as soon as group in front is clear.
 - The Ranger will be back on course starting tomorrow to ensure you keep up with the group in front at all times. There will be no stopping at the Bunker Bar, the field must keep moving. Should you require anything, please 'grab and go'.
 - The Major Pennant Team will play The Lakes in the Divisional Final at Camden Lakeside on Sunday at 7.50am. As mentioned last week, a bus will be travelling to the course and you are asked to let the office know if you are intending to go on the bus. There will be a **NO** charge for the bus and it leaves the Club at 6.00am.

Ball declared lost is found before another ball put into play

Question: A player searched for his ball for two minutes, declared it lost and started back to play another ball at the spot from which the original ball was played. Before he put another ball in play, his original ball was found within the five minute period allowed for search. What is the ruling?

Answer: A player cannot render a ball lost by declaration – see Definition of "lost Ball". The original ball remained in play – see "Definition of "Ball in Play".
