JAGER WINS BACK TO BACK PAXTON AVERAGE TROPHIES

Matt Jager (Melville Glades) has successfully defended his title as the States most consistent golfer by recording the lowest stroke average for the 2008/09 season. Matt won the trophy for the first time last year with an average of 69.90 and backed it up this year with a similar average of 70.08.

The trophy is awarded to the player who returns the lowest average for scores achieved in all state and national events and those club open events which have been awarded Paxton Average status from August through to June the following year.

Matt joins an illustrious group of players who have won the trophy multiple times since it's inception in 1970 including Terry Gale, Roger MacKay, Craig Parry, Stephen Leaney and more recently Michael Sim.

Matt's average of 70.08 was 0.29 better than Michael Dennis who notched up his fourth runner up placing in the past six years. Incredibly Michael finished third and fourth in the other two years.

Matt's second Paxton Average Trophy will sit nicely along side the Stephen Leaney Junior Stroke Average award he won in 2005 and 2006.
